



## 2023 Summer School FAQ's



**Location:** East Hartford Middle School, 777 Burnside Avenue, East Hartford

**Dates:**

June 12th- July 11th, 2023

Semester 1: June 12th- June 23rd

Semester 2: June 26th- July 11th

**Schedules:**

A Period 7:10-10:15am

B Period 10:20am-1:25pm

**Summer School Types:**

- **Traditional Summer School:** this form of summer school is designed for students who receive a failing grade within their courses. Students will be expected to attend the full 20 days of summer school to earn their credit.
- **Credit Earning Summer School:** students who've passed the course but lost credit due to attendance will be eligible to participate in the Credit Earning Summer School where they will be able recover credit using the APEX platform. Required lessons will be based on the number of absences and your final grade within the course. Attendance requirements are based on the successful completion of the assigned courses.

**Can I participate in the various programs within summer school?**

School counselors will complete a transcript review and will register students for either the Traditional Summer and/ or Credit Earning Summer programs based on eligibility criteria and need.

**How to register:**

Counselors will register students in Late May for their classes. Parents/ guardians will need to sign off on the Summer School Student Handbook to finalize registration for Summer School. The handbook contains the rules and regulations as well as policies related to attendance, dress code, and discipline. Students/ parents/ guardians have until the end of day on June 13<sup>th</sup> to provide a signed copy of the Summer School Handbook or the child will be subject to removal from Summer School.

**Attendance Policy:**

Summer School consists of only 20 sessions for a full credit course or 10 sessions for a half credit course. Students enrolled in a full credit course may not exceed more than two absences. Students enrolled in a half credit course may not exceed one absence. Tardies and early dismissals count towards attendance. A tardy is anywhere between 1-20 minutes late. If a student is 21 or more minutes late, it will be considered an absence. Similar guidelines apply for early dismissal.

Please note that three tardies, three early dismissals, or any three combinations of tardies and early dismissals will count as one absence for a class.

**Dress Code Policy:**

Tops: All tops must be purchased from approved vendors or be EHHS issued and approved.

- Short or long sleeve polo or tee shirts with school logo
- Short or long sleeve white oxford shirts with school logo, worn with or without a vendor approved tie
- Other available options include: cardigan sweater, sweater vest, fleece or blazer jacket
- No items considered outerwear may be carried,
- worn, or kept in the classroom during school hours.

Bottoms:

- Pants or sweatpants in solid black, gray, or tan, sized to fit the student, must be worn.
- Capris or shorts in solid black, gray or tan sized to fit the student
- Skirts in solid black, gray or tan that are no shorter than three inches above the knee.
- Bottoms that reveal any portion of the torso or undergarments, or that are too tight are unacceptable.
- Shoes: Footwear that marks the floors or is a safety hazard are prohibited.

**Grades:**

As consistent with the school year, grades will be posted using PowerSchool. Students and families should check their PowerSchool portal frequently to view their current academic performance.
